2. Exhibitor determines number per vegetable that make an attractive display. Potatoes may be included.

## DIVISION C – Crops

**RULES:**

1. All entries must be from current season's crop (except field corn and soybeans).
2. All sheaf entries must have a 3-inch diameter middle band.
