Division A – Exploring

EXPLORING RULES:

1. Maximum of 10 exploring entries per exhibitor.
2. Exploring classes are open to 4-H members enrolled in the Exploring project or beginning members of other organized youth groups in 3rd grade up to 5th grade (as of January 1 of current year)
3. All items must be made by exhibitor.
4. No Exploring project animals are left at the Fair after judging.
5. For poster exhibits, please see Rules & Regulations Jr. Division.
6. No migratory feather, nests or eggs allowed for exhibition.

Division B – Cloverbuds

CLOVERBUD RULES:

1. Maximum of 10 Cloverbud entries per exhibitor.
2. Cloverbud classes are open to 4-H members enrolled in the Cloverbud project and at least must be 5 years old, enrolled in kindergarten through 2nd grade. (as of January 1 of current year)
3. No live project animals are to be brought to the Fair by Cloverbuds.
4. No premium money will be given – all participants will receive a Cloverbud ribbon.
5. For poster exhibits, please see Rules & Regulations Jr. Division.
6. No migratory feathers, nests or eggs allowed for exhibition.
